What changes will we see in magic this year?

Performing magic in 2025 is likely to see a blend of traditional magic effects with increased integration of technology, augmented reality (AR), virtual reality (VR), and interactive elements, potentially creating more immersive and personalized experiences for audiences, while still maintaining the core elements of mystery and wonder that define magic.

Not so long ago when I thought about magic and technology my mind quickly went to WikiTest, Digital Force Bag and even D'Lite performed with addition of a "Bag O' Lites" gimmick for the finale. But, technology has moved past this in recent years. Al, VR and other digital tech in particular.

For instance, a show at Blackpool Convention opened with "HACKER". This is an electronic device that creates IOO WIFI networks per second and blasts them to everyone around you. You can instantly rename all the WIFI networks to ANYTHING you want. Their card. Their thought of word. Their chosen celebrity... Anything. For the mentalist who wants a fool-proof utility device and for these kind of predictions or mind-reading stunts it looks amazing. It should be amazing! It retails for \$229.00. Cool trick, but does that mean I should spend my hard-earned coin on this?

Technology can be expensive. Consider "The French Twins." Tony and Jordan are masters of illusion, blending magic and technology to create incredible shows worldwide. Their AGT act is on their website under "TV Highlights".

Think about it! For an estimated \$200,000 + you too could blend technology and illusionettes into a show that is Dubai and Las Vegas worthy! (So long as you have attractive twin female assistants and you are also an attractive twin.) Sigh... I was just living another person's life for a moment. Okay, I'm back.

I'm overstating a bit to drive a point home. I use some technology in my magic but, I don't put it on display. For example, I do a candy prediction trick that makes use of technology that must remain hidden or there is no magic. It was expensive... nearly \$300 and it's a one trick pony with slight variations but, I can get 8–10 minutes of performance time with it and (at the risk of sounding like a magic shop pitchman), it IS a reputation-maker.

I'm definitely pro-technology but I don't know how far down that digital path I'm willing to go. That's it for now. I'm going into d'magic study to practice D'Lites. (Gives mullet a subtle swing from left to right.) Yeah, baby!

The daughter of Dominique Duvivier, a living legend in magic, she faced a double challenge: to make a name for herself under the shadow of her illustrious father and to become a highly respected artist in the predominantly masculine world of magic. Unlike many children who grow up with a talented and famous parent, her father didn't push her to become a magician like himself. As a child he never showed her any tricks: it was only at the age of 15 that Alexandra decided to become, little by little, the worthy heiress of her father's empire.

She has become a favorite artist of the biggest brands for their private events (Hermes, Louis Vuitton, Chanel, L'Oréal...), has been a hand double for some of the most famous names in the cinema, she has no less than eight shows to her credit: three solo stage shows, three shows performed as a double act with her father, a children's show and a show performed entirely in English. With her sharp humor, her pure and engaging magic, her natural empathy with both young and old, she charms and amuses her ever-increasing audiences.

Beyond her artistic talents, Alexandra Duvivier is also a trainer and a business speaker (innovative methods of communication using magic) and an instructor for the first ever diploma in magic recognized by the Ministry of Labor in France.

Alexandra is a regular presence at FFFF and MAWNY as a performer, magic dealer, and speaker.
